Current address is 39A Commercial Street; this is a 2-story cross-gable cottage; the roof is clad in asphalt shingles; a brick chimney with terra cotta cap is located on the south slope; The exterior is clad in wood shingles with simple wood cornerboards; irregular Fenestration includes 6/6 DHS wood windows with inoperable shutters on the front façade, and rear picture windows; the second-story primary entrance is reach by a modern wood stair and includes a wood multi-pane and panel door and modern storm.
