Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

Address in the field is 101 Commercial Street; 101 Commercial Street is a 1-1/2-story, 2-bay sidehall cottage; front-gable roof with partial cornice returns is sheathed in asphalt shingles; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim, foundation is obscured; fenestration includes paired and single 1/1 DHS wood, 2/2 DHS wood, and 6/6 DHS wood; flat roof wall dormers; primary entrance is accessed by board-and-batten door with entablature surround; entrance has concrete block and brick steps and front wall; deck extends from rear façade; identified as "A Home At Last" on building signage and in historical drawings.
