77 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 3-bay structure with 2nd-story overhang on side facades; the roof is clad in wood shingles; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood cornerboards; fenestration includes 6/6 DHS vinyl windows, 4-pane vinyl casements, bay window with wood shingle roof and paired 9-pane wood fixed windows flanked by 3-pane sidelights; primary entrance has vertical plank front door; wood steps lead to secondary 2nd-story entrance with modern single-light door; rear façade has 2nd-story deck.
