75 Commercial St is a 2-story building with 2-story addition on rear; roof is clad in asphalt shingles with wood cornice, partial returns, and 2 interior brick chimneys; exterior is clad in wood shingles with simple corner pilasters; fenestration includes 6/6 DHS wood windows, 1/1 DHS vinyl replacements; 32-pane wood picture window, single-pane picture window on 1st floor and triple 6/6 DHS vinyl on 2nd floor.
