2-1/2-story; 3-bay side hall dwelling with significant alterations to rear facade; roof is clad in wood shingles; primary facade is clad in clapboard, secondary facades in wood shingles; fenestration includes 6/6 DHS vinyl windows with operable shutters with shutter dogs, simple wood crowns front facade; 4-light awnings; primary entrance has wood entablature and recessed paneled entry with a pane and panel door; secondary entry has shed roof with square porch posts; side basement entrance with plank door; 2nd-story deck on water side.
