71 Commercial St is a 2-story, 4-bay structure with a 2-story rear addition; pyramidal roof clad in asphalt shingles with central interior and rear brick chimneys; exterior clad in vinyl siding, rear addition clad in wood shingle; irregular fenestration includes 2/1 DHS wood, 1/1 DHS wood, 6/6 DHS wood, 12-pane picture window flanked by 4/4 DHS wood, single-light vinyl awning; inoperable shutters on primary facade; slight 2nd story overhang with cutaway entrance, primary entrance has been enclosed; 2-story open porches on side façade.
