65 Commercial St. is a 3-story, 4-bay side gable dwelling with a 2-story, 3-bay side ell; the roof is clad in asphalt shingles with a wood cornice and partial returns and rear shed dormer; a brick chimney is centered on the ridge of the larger section; fenestration includes 6/1 DHS, 2/2 DHS and 9/6 DHS wood windows; The primary entrance includes a wood pane and panel door surrounded by lattice-work archway; 2nd-story exterior steps lead to and upper deck and alternate entrance.
