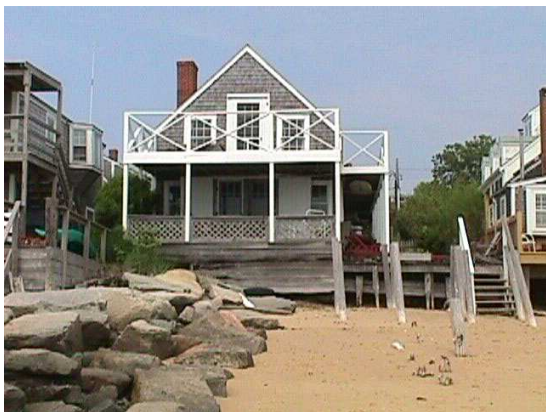

61A Commercial St is a 2-story; 3-bay cottage; the roof is clad in asphalt shingles with a simple wood cornice and includes a brick sidewall chimney; fenestration includes 6-pane wood awning windows, 12-pane wood casements, 9-pane wood casements; sliding glass door entry on front façade; an exterior staircase along the side façade leads to a 2nd-story front deck; the side façade includes a historic 2nd-story loft access with vertical plank wood door.
