82 Commercial St is a 1-story; 5-bay center hall, full cottage with rear ell; side-gable roof is clad in asphalt shingles with center brick chimney; gable dormers and shed dormer; cornice detail on main core and recessed side ell; exterior is clad in wood shingles; fenestration primarily 6/6 paired and single wood DHS with inoperable louvered shutters; primary entrance has panel door with storm door flanked by pilasters; bulkhead present on side facade; multi-pane and panel secondary entry door in connecting hyphen.
