119 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 5-bay Dutch Colonial Revival-style center-entry cottage; front-gambrel roof with cross-gable is sheathed in asphalt shingles, gable in rear contains shed dormer; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood corner boards, building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes single 2/1 DHS vinyl windows; primary entrance is accessed by pane-and-panel replacement door with vinyl entablature door surround; a 1-story addition with concrete block foundation and rooftop deck extends from the rear facade.
