110 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 4-bay vernacular Federal-style dwelling; hipped roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; exterior is clad in clapboard on front façade, wood shingles on other facades, wood corner boards, building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes single 6/6 vinyl DHS; primary entrance is accessed by a modern panel door flanked by shutters; entrance is sheltered by a 1-story flat-roof portico with balcony above, portico supported by Doric posts, with wood balustrade on balcony; 2-story addition and deck extends from rear facade.
