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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

112 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 3-bay cottage with a 2-story historic addition; gable-front roof is sheathed in wood shingles, interior brick chimney at roof ridge of core, and partial cornice returns; exterior is clad in clapboard with wood corner pilasters and trim, shed dormer on side roof slope is clad in wood shingles, building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes single 6/6 DHS windows with operable shutters, with 2/2 DHS and diamond-shape casement in shed dormer; primary entrance in center bay is accessed by Victorian-style wood pane-and-panel door, with a heavy entablature supported by pilasters; wood picket fence around property; historic addition contains a 2-story and 1-story sections; addition is lit by 2/2 and 6/6 wood DHS; addition's entrance is on Tremont Street.
