This building is 1-story and 3-bays, with a central entry. Also known as 10B Bradford Street, this building may have been a shed prior to its use as a residence. The windows are 6/1 replacement DHS with trim and inoperable shutters. Door is pane and panel with a storm door. 1 small single-light window is present in the gable end, near the peak. The right side façade contains 6/1 DHS. The rear façade contains wood shingle single-light casement in gable end.
