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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

This is a 2-story building with its gable end facing Bradford Street and its front facade facing Franklin Street. The gable end has 3 bays, and the front facade has 5 bays. Windows are 2/2 wood replacement DHS. Fenestration has been altered on the front facade to allow for multiple entry doors for residential use. Poured concrete steps lead to these entries. Building also contains partial corner returns and corner boards. The right side facade contains only 2nd-story 2/2 DHS windows in front portion. The left side facade has three entries with concrete stoops, modern doors and storms and 2/2 replacement DHS with storms and wood trim surrounds. The rear facade contains entries at 1st and 2nd levels, a 2nd story deck.
