48 Bradford Street is a 1-story, 5-bay center entry full cottage. The Halifax roof type (a variation on the saltbox) gives the building a long, medium pitched roof slope in the front and a short low-pitched slope in the back to accommodate a half or full story at the rear. The door is a panel door with 4 transom lights incorporated into the door. The door surround contains scalloped molding across the top. A storm door is installed. Windows are 6/6 DHS wood with storm windows and wood trim. The chimney is concrete block. The property is bordered by a white picket fence.
