183-185 Commercial St. is a 1-story, 5-bay astylistic commercial building; parallel-gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; exterior is clad in wood shingles with facing on the lower portion of the front facade; building sits on a concrete block foundation; fenestration includes triple and paired 8/8 vinyl DHS on front façade, vinyl Chicago-style picture windows along side façade, paired 6/6 wood DHS windows in gable end; primary entrance is accessed by a modern metal and glass door; modern gable cupolas on the roof peak; wood awning with asphalt shingle roof and supported by modern wood brackets is centered on the front façade, with scalloped edging and brackets under the eave.
