206 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, 3-bay Italianate-style dwelling that was undergoing significant alterations when surveyed; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, brick chimney, scroll-sawn eave brackets; most exterior cladding has been removed, down to the beaded boards, but some aluminum siding remains on a side facade; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes 2/1 wood DHS on front (Commercial St.) facade, but most windows have been removed.
