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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

225 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 3-bay, astylistic commercial building; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood corner boards and trim; building sits on a parged foundation; fenestration includes 9-pane wood display windows, 6-pane wood casements, 6/6 DHS, attic window covered with operable louvered shutters; primary entrance is located in center bay of enclosed 1-story porch and is accessed by double pane-and-panel doors with aluminum storm doors; slight wall flare between 1st and 2nd stories; 2nd-story deck over the storefront has matchstick balustrades and is reached by an exterior wood staircase on the side façade; 2nd-story entrance is accessed by double doors flanked by 6/6 wood DHS.
