226-228 Commercial St. is a 3-story, Second Empire-style commercial building; mansard roof is sheathed in wood shingles, paired and single gable dormers, box dormer; exterior is clad in wood shingles with clapboard siding on the west façade and brick facing under 1st-story windows; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes single-pane fixed storefront windows, 1/1 vinyl DHS, bow window with three 1/1 DHS on 2nd story; primary entrance is located on the west façade and is accessed by paired entry doors with flat roof and elaborate corner brackets; exterior wood staircase on east façade; modern 3rd-story roof-top addition.
