288 Commercial St. is a 2-story, Italianate-style commercial building; gable-front roof with false front is sheathed in asphalt shingles, cornice with large and small paired brackets; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood corner boards and trim; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes plate glass display windows on front façade, large single-light window, 1/1 DHS and 6/6 DHS on side facades; storefront on left has a recessed entry, storefront on right is accessed by flush paired doors; exterior staircase and deck near rear on left side façade; right side façade has a rear addition and side entries.
