129A Bradford Street is a 2-story, 3-bay, Dutch Colonial Revival-style dwelling; The side gambrel roof is clad in asphalt shingles, with shallow shed dormers, the exterior chimney is concrete block.; The exterior is clad in wood shingles, the 2nd story slightly overhangs the 1st and the foundation is obscured; The fenestration includes 2/2 DHS with wood trim and storm windows; The primary entrance is situated to 1 side of the primary façade.
