349 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, 3-bay, vernacular Italianate-style commercial building; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, shed dormers; exterior is clad in wood shingles and vertical plank siding; building sits on an obscured foundation; fenestration includes 1/1 vinyl DHS windows, fixed single-pane storefront windows with molded trim; paired single-pane vinyl casements on side façade; recessed, raised main entry with paired large-pane wood doors; 1st-story cornice over storefront with dentils under eave; side entrance is accessed by modern door with balustrade above; 2nd-story deck wraps around to south facade; building almost entirely encompassed by addition; appears to be attached to a 1-1/2-story side-gable cottage that has been altered beyond recognition and contains a shed wall dormer, 1-story modern glass shed gallery addition.
