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### ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

334 Commercial St. is a 3-story, 3-bay, astylistic mixed-use commercial/residential building; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles and has gable wall dormers; exterior is clad in clapboard siding with wood corner boards and trim; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes paired single-pane storefront windows, 1/1 DHS, paired vinyl casements, single-light fixed windows, Chicago-style multi-pane window flanked by 4/4 DHS, 1/1 DHS in large shed dormer; primary entrance in center bay with recessed paired modern glass doors; entrance portico supported by Doric columns; 2nd-story deck encompassed in roofline; 2nd-story enclosed porch with ribbon of 6/6 DHS windows; stepped rear façade has 3rd-story deck with exterior staircase and roof deck; exterior staircases on west façade to upper story entrances; roof deck; walkway to deck and steps at 336 Commercial Street.
