346 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 1-bay, astylistic dwelling converted to commercial use; flat roof has a built-up roof surface, a wood balustrade creates a parapet at the roofline; exterior is clad in stucco; the entire primary facade is a 2-story bay, the 1st story contains a storefront with centered and paired doors and flanking single-light windows, and the 2nd story has a balcony accessed by sliding glass doors; extensive decorative painting on exterior plywood attached to building; brick steps; east façade contains 1-story shed-roof addition; exterior wood staircase to deck on rear facade; the building has been joined with 344 Commercial Street.
