348 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 5-bay, Colonial Revival-style dwelling; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim; building sits on a parged brick foundation; fenestration includes 6/6 DHS with storms, inoperable louvered shutters; primary entrance is located in the center bay and is accessed by a panel door and storm door; brick walkway to Commercial Street entrance; side façade contains an exterior wood staircase to upper-story wood deck; right side façade has 1-story addition with entry and vestibule with storm awning window.
