Address in field: 405 Commercial Street; 405-407 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 3-bay, Greek-Revival-style commercial building; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, partial cornice return, shed dormer; exterior is clad in clapboard with wood shingles on the shed dormer; building sits on an obscured foundation; fenestration includes 1/1 vinyl DHS, 32-pane storefront windows; primary entrance located in the center bay has a simple wood surround featuring a fan and leaf design and is capped by an entablature; exterior staircase on side facade to 2nd- and 3rd-story entrances; south facade porches on 2nd and 3rd stories; two rear additions, one with a shallow gable roof and the other with a steeply pitched gable roof, other details are obscured.
