403 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, 3-bay dwelling; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, full-width shed dormer; exterior is clad in clapboard siding on the front façade and asbestos shingles on the secondary façades, with wood shingles in the gable ends, and on the shed dormer and rear addition; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes 1/1 vinyl DHS, 2/1 DHS in shed dormer; elaborate entry vestibule with brackets under eave; wood pane-and-panel door is flanked by 7-pane sidelights; 2nd-story addition on rear façade; deck on south façade.
