Partially OBSCURED FROM VIEW; the 3rd building at 361A-C Commercial St. is a 1-story, 1-bay vernacular Colonial Revival-style former workshop converted to retail space; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt roof shingles; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim; building sits on a pier foundation; primary entrance is accessed by paired single-pane modern doors.
