The outbuilding at 467 Commercial St. is a 1-story, 1-bay former blacksmith shop; gable-front roof is sheathed in wood shingles, interior brick chimney with two decorative terra cotta caps; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes 2/2 wood DHS on side façade; primary entrance is accessed by paired wood panel doors with wood trim; thin vertical beaded board storage door on front façade.
