453 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, 3-bay, Greek Revival-style dwelling converted to multi-family use; gable-front roof is sheathed in wood shingles, gable and shed dormers, interior brick chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles with diamond-shaped shingles; building sits on a poured concrete foundation; fenestration includes vinyl casements in all windows with the exception of a 28-pane picture window on 1st floor of front façade; window in gable end is a single-pane vinyl casement with wood fanlight above; front entrance replaced with 1/1 vinyl DHS windows and faux paneling above; double gable dormer with modern vinyl casement windows and shed portion in between on side roof slope; exterior staircase entry on sides to the 2nd and 3rd stories; front yard is enclosed by a wood picket fence.
