434 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, astylistic dwelling; cross-gable roof is sheathed in wood shingles, shed dormer on right side roof slope; exterior is clad in wood shingles; building sits on a raised brick foundation; fenestration includes 2/1 and 1/1 DHS replacement windows, all inoperable shutters, simple wood surrounds; a large entablature caps the doorway, which is accessed by a replacement door; wood deck.
