452 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, 2 bay, vernacular Italianate-style dwelling; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, full cornice return; exterior is clad in clapboard siding with wood corner pilasters; fenestration includes 2-story square bay on front façade, paired and single 2/2 and 6/6 wood DHS, storm windows; Colonial Revival primary entrance with broken pediment and sidelights is accessed by a wood panel replacement door. Side ell has 6/6 DHS in gabled dormer, interior brick ridge chimney, verandah with 2nd-story deck, and a square bay in 1st story with 2/1 DHS wood window.
