Address in field "195 Bradford Street"; 466 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 4-bay, astylistic dwelling; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, interior brick end chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles; building sits on a poured concrete foundation; fenestration is irregular and includes paired single-light casements, paired and single 12/12 wood DHS replacements and 8/8 wood DHS replacements; the 2nd-story entry is on the gable end, facing Bradford Street, and is accessed by a wood pane-and-panel door reached by an exterior wood staircase; an open deck located on the south façade is clad in latticework.
