541 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 2-bay dwelling; gable-front roof is sheathed in wood shingles; modern skylight; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood corner boards and trim; fenestration includes triple modern 1/1 vinyl DHS windows, cabinet-style bay window; primary entrance is accessed by a modern wood door with offset 12-light leaded glass window; entrance is sheltered by a pent eave; concrete stoop.
