535 Commercial St. is a 2-3 story, 10-bay, multi-family dwelling; irregular roof consists of 3 parallel front gables with flat-roof sections in between; roofs are sheathed in asphalt shingles; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim; fenestration includes 1/1 vinyl DHS, 2/2 wood DHS, 3/3 wood DHS, 3-pane wood awning windows, single-pane vinyl casement windows, single-pane fixed windows; shed dormers on some roof slopes; partial cornice returns; interior brick chimney; accessed by several wood panel and wood pane-and-panel doors; exterior steps to alternate entrances on upper stories; modern sliding glass doors on south side.
