Address in field: 487-489 Commercial Street; 487 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story former workshop/cottage converted to residential use; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, partial cornice returns, interior brick chimney with round cap; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes 2/1 wood DHS, 6/6 wood DHS with operable shutters, single-pane awning window in attic; canted bay window on Commercial St. façade has wood shingle roof, single-pane fixed window with snap-in muntins, flanked by 1/1 wood DHS with 2/2 snap-in muntins; main entrance not visible from street; exterior steps in rear to access 2nd-floor entrance; front yard is enclosed by a wood picket fence.
