219 Bradford Street is a 2-story, 3-bay, Greek Revival-style sidehall cottage; the roof is front gable with partial cornice returns; the exterior is clad in wood shingles and there are corner boards; the fenestration includes 2/2 wood DHS with inoperable plank shutters; the primary entrance has a historic pane and panel wood door with modern storm and simple entablature; the building has a deck attached to the rear façade.
