532 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 5-bay dwelling; side-gable roof is sheathed in wood shingles; gable dormer on front roof slope; shed dormer on rear roof slope; interior brick ridge chimney; exterior is clad in clapboard siding on the front façade and wood shingles on the secondary facades with wood corner boards and trim; fenestration includes 6/6 DHS replacement windows with snap-in muntins, band of 6/6 DHS in shed dormer, 1st story of rear façade has 6/6 and 1/1 DHS; primary entrance is accessed by a pane-and-panel door with storm door; rear façade contains 1-story ell with 3/3 and 6/6 DHS and secondary entry; front yard is enclosed by a wood picket fence.
