This is a 2-story, 3-bay dwelling with a center gable roof. Windows are paired and single 1/1 DHS, and single windows are symmetrically placed on the primary façade. An octagonal window is located in the 2nd-story, left bay of the primary façade. The pane and panel primary door is located on the gable end. The door is flanked by sidelights.
