621 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 3-bay former cottage/studio; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; shallow shed dormer; skylight; rear gable end chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood corner boards and trim; fenestration includes 1/1 DHS windows; entrance in center bay is sheltered by a pediment hood with wood posts; modern wood deck on front façade; shed addition with skylights and sliding glass doors.
