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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

603 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 8-bay, commercial lodging building; side-gable roof is sheathed in wood shingles; paired interior brick corbelled chimneys; exterior is clad in clapboard siding with wood trim; fenestration includes 6/6 wood DHS, 4/4 wood DHS windows; full-length shed dormer on side roof slope; entry on street side is accessed by modern paired multi-pane French doors flanked by 5-pane sidelights; exterior steps with lattice work to 2nd-story entry. Ell section has full-length shed dormer with 6/6 wood DHS and 2nd-story entrance with latticework; 1st-story entrance on one side with a shed hood and two other entrances with no hoods; dormers clad in wood shingles.
