593 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 4-bay boathouse converted to residential use; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; exterior brick chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim; fenestration includes 6/6 vinyl DHS, 4-pane vinyl casement windows; entry on side façade is accessed by a vertical beaded board door with strap hinges; enclosed porch with hipped roof; shed dormer; 6-pane paired vinyl casements with operable shutters.
