Address in field: 583 Commercial Street; 583-583A Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 3-bay dwelling with an irregular-shaped addition to side and rear; side-gable roof is sheathed in wood shingles; exterior is clad in clapboard siding with wood trim; fenestration includes 6/6 vinyl DHS, 8/8 vinyl DHS windows; window trim; large interior corbelled brick central chimney with battlemented rim; corner pilasters and partial cornice returns; altered fenestration on primary façade; entrance enclosed in hipped-roof vestibule and accessed on north side by a pane-and-panel door with bull's eye glass; shed dormer on front façade; 2-story shed section added on south side with another chimney; 2-story octagonal tower on the south side; modern single-pane and 6-pane vinyl casements.
