581 Commercial St. is a 1-1/2-story, 5-bay center entry cottage; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; partial cornice returns; interior brick chimney; skylights; exterior is clad in clapboard siding; fenestration includes 1/1 vinyl DHS windows; decorative door surround includes heavy entablature; corner pilasters and entablature cornice; window trim. 2-story, cross-gable addition includes large corbelled and crenellated exterior brick chimney, 1/1 vinyl DHS, single-pane vinyl casements, partial cornice returns. 3rd-story addition contains a gable dormer with partial cornice returns and paired single-pane vinyl casements.
