575 Commercial St. is a former 1-story, 3-bay cottage that was recently enlarged and altered to create a 2-1/2-story, 3-bay dwelling; the side-gable roof is sheathed in wood shingles; exterior is clad in clapboard siding on the front façade with wood shingles on the secondary facades; fenestration includes a multi-pane canted oriel window on the 1st story, 6/6 vinyl DHS, triple 4-pane casement windows in the shed dormers, and a bay window with 6-pane casements and 9-pane fixed window; primary entrance is accessed by a modern panel door with a 3-light transom.
