Obscured from view; The outbuilding at 600 Commercial St. is a 1-story cottage with a 2-story rear addition. The original portion has a gable roof sheathed in asphalt shingles, wood shingle wall cladding, and awning windows located under the eaves. The rear portion has a low-pitched shed roof, wood shingle wall cladding, a wall of windows in the 2nd story below the shed roof, and is accessed by a slab door in the 1st story under the windows. The rear addition may function as a studio.
