285 Bradford Street is a 2-story, 3-bay, Astylistic dwelling; the halifax roof is clad in asphalt shingles, with a shed dormer and concrete block exterior end chimney; the exterior is clad in wood shingles and the foundation is concrete block; the fenestration is irregular and contains 4-light vinyl casement windows, shed wall dormer has triple 4-light wood fixed windows and single-pane fixed windows located on the side facades; the primary entrance contains a central door and surround with pilasters and a pediment;

Between the 1970s and 2002, this building was a multi-family dwelling with separate entries on each level; The 2nd-story entry was located directly above the 1st, and a deck wrapped around the left portion of the primary façade from the 2nd-story door.
