283 Bradford Street is a 1 1/2-story; 3-bay, Astylistic building; the side-gable roof is clad in wood shingles with an interior brick chimney, shed dormer on east façade and partial cornice returns; the exterior is clad in wood shingles and the foundation is obscured; the fenestration includes 6/6 wood DHS with operable shutters, shed dormer also has 6/6 wood DHS; the primary entrance has a gable hood and is located on west façade near south corner; 1-story, gable-roof section extends to south with another interior brick chimney
