663 Commercial St. is a 2-story, 4-bay dwelling; house raised above street level; offset front-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt roof shingles; gable wall dormer; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood corner boards and trim; fenestration includes 2/2 wood DHS with inoperable shutters, 1/1 vinyl DHS in gable wall dormer; entrance between front windows is accessed by a wood plank door; recessed porch on right front corner with board-and-batten door; wrap-around wood deck on front and side façade with brick steps to door; hipped wrap-around porch on south facade with exposed rafters and supported by square posts; attached 1-car garage with flat roof and paired beaded vertical board doors.
