646 Commercial Street is a 2-story, 4-bay dwelling with an enclosed front porch. The main entry has been moved to the left side. The right side of the front gambrel roof has been raised to create an irregular roofline. The windows in the enclosed porch are paired single-light casements, while the 2nd-story windows are 1/1 DHS. The left side façade contains shallow shed dormers with 1/1 DHS. The entry has storm door and 5-light sidelights. Windows are paired casements. The entry is accessed by a brick stoop. The right side façade contains 1/1 DHS, single-light awning, and 4-light awnings. Porch on rear of building.
